Commentary published in *The Lancet* in 2011 also notes **"A demonstrable reduction of the burden of cervical cancer - the main goal of HPV vaccines - will take several decades"**. [1]

This is certainly not the message the public is receiving via the scientific/medical establishment, which aggressively promotes the 'effectiveness' of HPV vaccination, and stifles concerns about HPV vaccine safety.
